

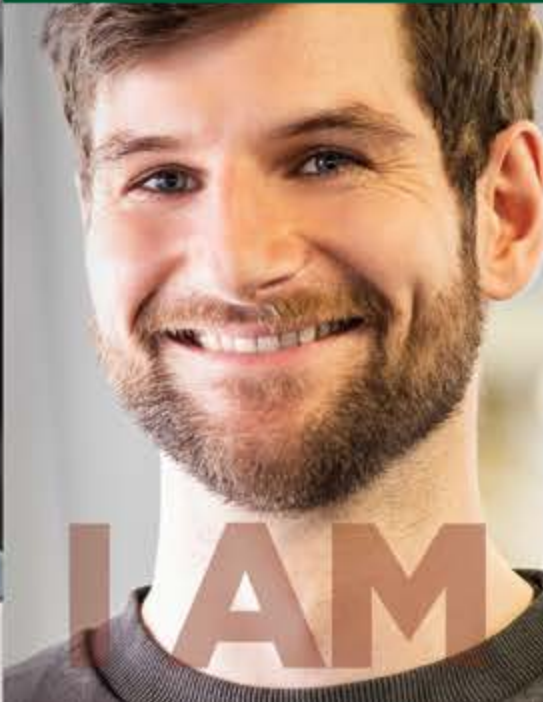
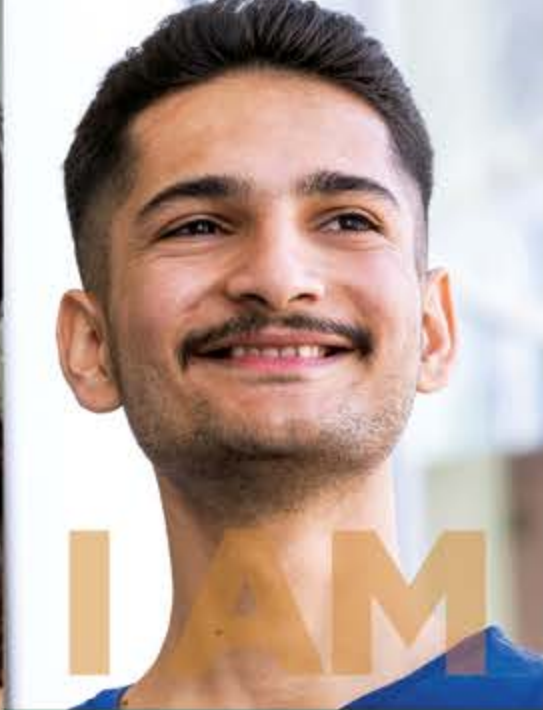

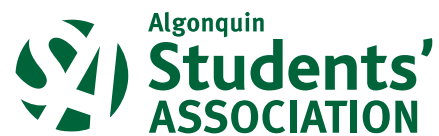

REVIEW PROGRAM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

PREPARE YOUR DOCUMENTS

Prepare copies of your original supporting documents (transcripts, diplomas, IELTS/TOEFL/DUOLINGO score, etc.) and certified translations (if necessary) in a digital format, so you can upload them in the application portal.

ACCEPT & PAY FEES

YOU'VE BEEN ACCEPTED

If accepted, a Letter of Acceptance (LOA) will be uploaded to the Application Portal.

The deadline will be on your Letter of Acceptance. If your payment will be delayed, contact the admissions officer on your letter, and let them know.

PREPARE FOR TRAVEL

BEGIN YOUR STUDY PERMIT APPLICATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

Allow at least 2-3 months for processing. Please note processing times vary by country.

Apply for a Co-op/Internship Work Permit in addition to your Study Permit, if necessary.

PREPARE FOR YOUR TRIP — ARRANGE ACCOMMODATIONS, BOOK TICKETS, ETC.

Plan to arrive on campus approximately 1-2 weeks prior to the start of classes to attend the orientation sessions and allow time to get to know your new environment.

CONSIDER A SECOND PROGRAM

Go further with your education

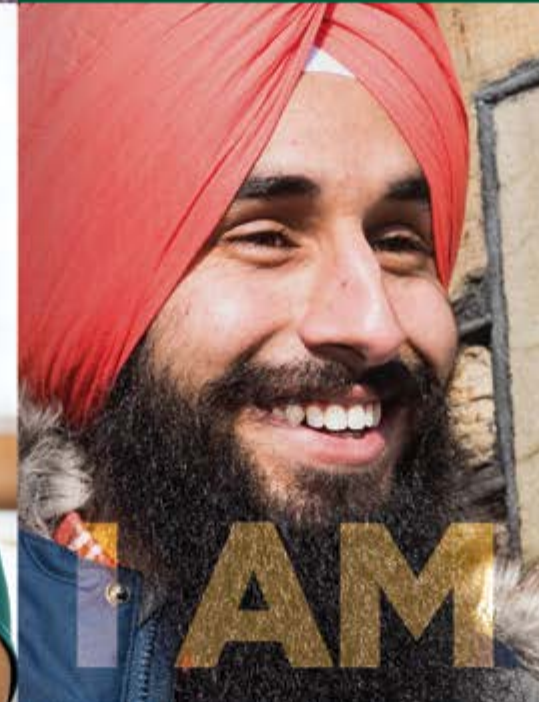
