### Student Population

- 41,028 full-time and part-time students.
- 489 full-time international students from 25 countries.



### Employment Outcomes

- 92% of graduates find employment in their field.

- Average class size is 28 students.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### English Proficiency Requirements

- Grade 12 English: minimum grade of C (or equivalent)
- IELTS (Academic): 6.5 overall, minimum 6.0 in each skill band
- PTE (Academic): 58 overall, minimum skill band score applies
- TOEFL (iBT): 80 overall, minimum 20 in each skill band

### General Admission Requirements

- Certificate, diploma, and bachelor programs: successful completion of high school.
- Post-baccalaureate diploma programs: successful completion of a recognized bachelor's degree.

## HOW TO APPLY

1. Apply online at [jibc.ca/apply](http://jibc.ca/apply) and pay the \$150 application fee.
2. Send your proof of English proficiency, relevant transcripts, and supporting documents to [international@jibc.ca](mailto:international@jibc.ca).
3. Receive the 'Offer of Admission' letter.
4. Pay the commitment deposit of \$5,000.
5. Receive the 'Letter of Acceptance (LOA)' and 'Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL)'.
6. Apply for your study permit.

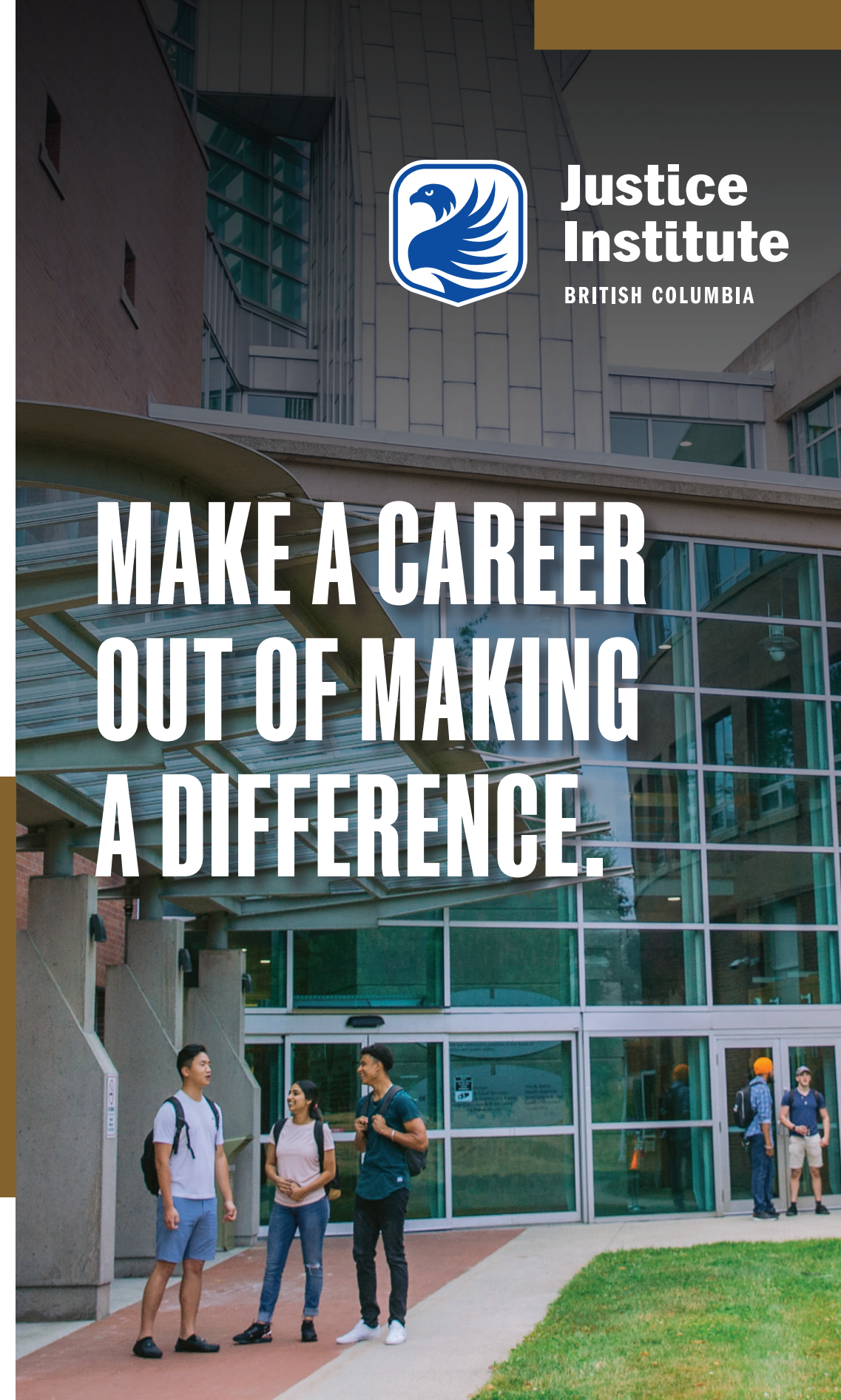

## AREAS OF STUDY

### Law Enforcement & Investigation

Prepare for a career in law enforcement and public safety. Learn about Canadian criminal law, the criminal justice system, and administrative and civil law. You will also build soft skills such as negotiation and mediation.

Grads start their careers in areas of law such as litigation support and employee relations. They can also work in fraud prevention, compliance, security, and bylaw enforcement. Job titles include paralegal, legal assistant, and contract administrator.

### Emergency Management

Learn what to do in an emergency.. From planning and prevention to response and recovery, we will prepare you to handle any crisis.

Grads work in many industries and roles. They create emergency plans, interpret laws, and prepare for business disruption. They also assess risk, run operations centres, and train community members.

### Paramedicine

Prepare for a career that makes a true difference in people's lives. Be trained to respond to medical and trauma emergencies.

Paramedics respond to 911 emergency calls. When they arrive at the scene of an emergency, they use their knowledge to assess a patient's condition. After assessment, they take action by applying recommended guidelines and procedures.
